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Plumbing problems rarely appear at a hassle-free time. In Philadelphia, I have seen more flooded basements at 2 a.m. Than at any sensible hour of the workday. Old housing stock, narrow rowhomes, shared sewer lines, and winter season temperature swings all make pipes here a little bit more unforgiving than in numerous other cities.
