

Mississauga Weather at a Glance

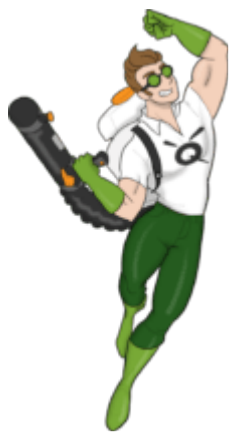
