So in which does the experience of "patriotism as hindrance" come from? Three overlapping shifts.

Faith, race, gender, orientation, occupation, place, workforce, genre, franchise, weight loss plan - we signal multiple thing at a time. When any unmarried identity insists on heart level, the room pushes returned.

Justification may also be protecting, as in "I am now not that variety of patriot," which tells the listener what you reject. It can also be invitational, as in "Here is what the flag capability to me," which tells the listener what you cherish. The big difference subjects. Defensive pleasure most likely hardens, then searches for enemies. Invitational satisfaction tends to widen, then searches for guests.

Several instances a yr I ask scholars to describe a time they felt proud of the country. The answers vary from the moon landing to marriage equality, from the GI Bill to the polio vaccine, from the non violent transfer of strength after chaotic elections to a regional library that stocks books in lots of languages. When I turn the query and ask what has upset them, they resolution with identical care, list unkept promises, botched wars, systemic harms, and leaders who reduced the bar. The level is not very to stability the ledger but to refuse the thought that love of united states of america requires pretending the ledger does now not exist.

If you truthfully suppose america is capable of enchancement, then your pride could be both show worrying and conditional. Not pride that waits for perfection, and not delight that excuses all the pieces. Pride that announces, we outfitted a resilient framework, continuously stretched it, frequently broke it, and will recommit to solving what we bend. No flag necessities to fear that sentence.

Is refusing to fly the flag a statement - or a symptom of a thing deeper?
