This single update triggered an enormous shockwave in the trading community, permanently separating "investable skins" from "practical keys."

Types of Keys in Counter-Strike

Not all keys are created equal. Throughout the years, Valve presented numerous variations of keys tied to particular collections or events.

1. Requirement Case Keys

Purchased straight from the in-game shop for £ 2.50. These can open the large majority of standard weapon cases currently dropping in the game.

2. Operation Keys
