How Does Your Home's Service Amperage Affect Outlet Replacement Pricing?

What Role Does Available Breaker Space Play in Your Final Quote?

Your electrical panel contains breaker spaces—slots where circuit breakers connect to the bus bars. Each breaker protects one circuit. A panel might have 20, 30, or 40 breaker spaces depending on age and design. When you want a new outlet, the electrician must run a new circuit and install a new breaker. If all breaker spaces are full, there is nowhere to add that breaker, even if your overall amperage hasn't been exceeded. Homes in neighborhoods like the Paseo often have older 100-amp panels with only 16 or 20 spaces, many already occupied. In those cases, adding a single outlet requires either a sub-panel installation (around \$500–\$800) or a full panel upgrade (around \$1,500–\$4,000).
