As the table highlights, the odds of pulling a Covert product are less than 1%, and the chances of protecting a rare Special product (a knife or a set of gloves) hover around a weak **0.26%**-- roughly a 1-in-385 possibility per case.

The Economics of Unboxing: Expectation vs. Reality

It is crucial to view CS2 unboxing through the lens of home entertainment rather than investment. Mathematically, the Expected Value (EV) of opening a basic CS2 case is negative.

When a player opens a case, the huge majority of the time, they will get a Mil-Spec or Restricted skin that is worth substantially less than the £ 2.50 crucial utilized to open it.

- **Very Little Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15
- **Field-Tested (FT):** 0.15-- 0.38
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Some skins look extraordinary even at greater wear values, while others look heavily damaged. Knowing how float worths effect cost is essential if you intend to trade or sell your unboxed products.

3. Consider Buying Directly

If there is a particular skin you desperately desire, the most cost-effective route is nearly always purchasing it directly off the Steam Market or a relied on third-party marketplace, instead of attempting to gamble for it through case openings.
