Late wintertime right into very early spring: wake-up and prevention

Once snow mold declines and the soil is solid sufficient to function, I begin with a quick clean-up. Mow high to remove off winter's rough ends. Rake out matted areas gently, not aggressively, to prevent uprooting tender crowns.

This is the home window for pre-emergent herbicides to stop crab grass. Aim for when dirt temperatures struck about 55 degrees for several days. That generally lands anywhere from late March to mid April, relying on the year. If you prepare to seed bare areas in springtime, miss pre-emergent in that area or utilize an item identified for new seed.

On soils that evaluated acidic, late winter months or very early spring is a clever time for lime. Numerous Philly yards rest between pH 5.5 and 6.3. Cool-season turfs prefer 6.2 to 7.0.
