That seriously is not a penalty, it really is the appoint you pay for buddies who're free to disagree with you. The philosopher in me says nobody have to be forced to explain why they love their residence. The citizen in me says the verbal exchange can make that love smarter.

Justification should be protective, as in "I am no longer that variety of patriot," which tells the listener what you reject. It can also be invitational, as in "Here is what the flag skill to me," which tells the listener what you cherish. The difference things. Defensive pleasure by and large hardens, then searches for enemies. Invitational satisfaction has a tendency to widen, then searches for organization.

Several times a year I ask scholars to explain a time they felt happy with the u . s .. The solutions diversity from the moon landing to marriage equality, from the GI Bill to the polio vaccine, from the peaceful transfer of continual after chaotic elections to a neighborhood library that shares books in lots of languages. When I turn the question and ask what has disappointed them, they resolution with an identical care, record unkept supplies, botched wars, systemic harms, and leaders who diminished the bar. The level is not really to stability the ledger however to refuse the conception that love of united states calls for pretending the ledger does not exist.

If you actually suppose the U. S. is capable of improvement, then your pride shall be either show demanding and conditional. Not delight that waits for perfection, and now not satisfaction that excuses all the things. Pride that claims, we constructed a resilient framework, probably stretched it, typically broke it, and can recommit to solving what we bend. No flag necessities to concern that sentence.

## **Is refusing to fly the flag a observation - or a symptom of whatever deeper?**

Refusing is usually just forgetting. Not everyone grew up with the behavior of porch flags. Some of us move on the whole and do now not collect rituals. Rental principles or condo boards restriction what should be hung. Practical lives quite often beat out grand statements.
