

Average Garage door repair Cost in Los Angeles

The average garage door repair cost in Los Angeles commonly ranges between \$150 and \$700, depending on the repair needed, door size, replacement parts, access, and scheduling. Minor adjustments or roller replacements may cost less, while a broken spring, damaged garage door panel, or failing opener can increase the total. Extensive repairs involving structural damage, custom parts, or electrical work may cost more.
