Weapon Wear Conditions

- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07 (Pristine, very little scratches)
- **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15 (Slight acnes)
- **Field-Tested (FT):** 0.15-- 0.38 (Noticeable wear and tear)
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45 (Significant scratches and fading)
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00 (Extremely used, often funny textures)

A skin like the *AWP|Asiimov* looks entirely different in Field-Tested condition compared to Battle-Scarred, significantly changing its market price.

Why Do Players Open Cases?

With such low mathematical chances of making a revenue, why do countless dollars worth of cases get opened monthly? The phenomenon can be credited to a number of psychological and cultural aspects:

- **The Thrill of the Gamble:** The flashing lights, the sound results, and the slowing ticker produce an intense dopamine rush comparable to a slot device.
- **Flex Culture:** In competitive matches, having an unusual knife or a flashy AK-47 skin is a status sign. It reveals devotion, wealth, or simply good fortune.
- **Financial investment Potential:** While dangerous, some uncommon skins value in value with time, turning virtual pixels into genuine digital assets.
- **Material Creation:** Platforms like YouTube and Twitch are flooded with "opening 1,000 cases" videos, sustaining public interest and the desire to attempt one's own luck.

Safe Alternatives to In-Game Opening

Because opening cases straight through the video game has an extremely low roi (ROI), the CS2 neighborhood has actually developed alternative methods for getting skins:
