

North Beach is one of those Miami Beach neighborhoods that reveals itself slowly. It does not rely on the glossy, high-volume energy that many visitors associate with South Beach. Instead, it offers a quieter, more lived-in version of coastal South Florida, where Art Deco buildings sit near family-run restaurants, beach access points feel local rather than staged, and the ocean is always just a few blocks away.
