

What counts as a pest emergency in Windsor?

A pest problem becomes an emergency when the **infestation** is no longer isolated, is causing visible **property damage**, or is creating a serious **health risk** for people or pets. In practice, that means you may need **emergency pest control** if pests are actively spreading, showing up in multiple rooms, or affecting food, sleeping areas, walls, wiring, or ventilation.
