Regardless of these steps, the market continues to adjust. Many modern CS2 gambling establishments utilize peer-to-peer (P2P) trading systems or cryptocurrency combinations to bypass traditional trade constraints enforced by Steam, showing resistant in the face of designer crackdowns.
