3. Rarity Tiers and Drop Odds

Each case includes 5 rarity tiers, each with an assigned probability. The following table illustrates the approximate drop opportunities for a standard case such as the **Chroma Case**.

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Note: The precise portions can differ slightly from one case to another, but the hierarchy remains constant.

4. Popular Cases and Their Market Values
