# Repairing Checklist: How to Fix CS2 Crashes

## 1. Verify Game File Integrity

- Open Steam and navigate to your **Library**.

## 2. Update Graphics Drivers

- Guarantee **Reflex Low Latency** is set to "Enabled + Boost" rather than triggering conflicts with your particular CPU.

## 4. Handle Overlays and Background Applications

Overlays are well-known for triggering hook conflicts with the Source 2 engine. Consider disabling:

- Discord Overlay
- Steam Overlay (Right-click CS2 in Steam > > Properties > > General > Enable the Steam Overlay while in-game -> >
- Toggle OFF)NVIDIA GeForce Experience Shadowplay/ In-Game Overlay
