No two skins are completely identical, thanks to the Float Value system. A float worth is a decimal number in between **0.00 and 1.00** that determines how worn or battle-scarred a skin looks.

Use Category Float Value Range Visual Characteristics **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Pristine, very little to no scratches or imperfections. **Minimal Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Really minor wear, usually near the edges or high-friction locations. **Field-Tested (FEET)** 0.15-- 0.38 Obvious scratches, scuffs, and fading. Most typical classification. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Substantial wear, heavy scratching, and noticeable paint loss. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Significantly weathered, in some cases totally modifying the weapon's appearance.

Note: Some skins are "capped," indicating they can not drop in Factory New condition (e.g., the AWP|Asiimov maxes out at Field-Tested).

StatTrak™ and Souvenirs

Gamers can also obtain unique versions of skins:

- **StatTrak™**: Features an LCD counter ingrained in the weapon that tracks the variety of eliminates made with that specific product.
- **Souvenir**: Dropped exclusively during main Valve-sponsored esports tournaments (Majors), featuring gold sticker labels of the teams and MVP of the round.

The CS2 Skin Economy: Why Do They Cost So Much?

The economy surrounding CS2 skins is greatly driven by supply and need. Due to the fact that skins are acquired mostly through random drops, opening weapon cases with keys, or trading, rare products command staggering rates. Some famous knives and rare-patterned rifles have actually sold for hundreds of thousands of dollars.

Several elements determine the value of a CS2 skin:

1. **Rarity Tier:** Consumer (White), Industrial (Light Blue), Mil-Spec (Dark Blue), Restricted (Purple), Classified (Pink), Covert (Red), and Exceedingly Rare (Gold/Knives and Gloves).
2. **Drift and Pattern Indexes:** Certain patterns (like the "Blue Gem" Case Hardened knife or the "Low Float" Crimson Web) are incredibly rare and valued by collectors.
3. **Pro Player Popularity:** If a prominent esports expert uses a specific skin during a Major, its demand often increases.
4. **Discontinuation:** Skins from old operations or gotten rid of cases can no longer drop naturally, shrinking the supply while need stays stable.

- **Enable Steam Guard:** Always use two-factor authentication (Steam Guard Mobile Authenticator) to protect your account.
- **Double-check trade URLs:** When trading with others, ensure you are trading with the actual user and not an impersonator account with a comparable name and avatar.
