

Westhampton Beach has a way of feeling familiar even if you are visiting for the first time. The village sits at that sweet spot on Long Island where the pace slows just enough for people to notice the details, the shape of the storefronts, the salt in the air, the sound of traffic thinning as you get closer to the ocean. It is a place with real civic life, not just seasonal traffic.
