Mathematically speaking, opening cases is a losing financial proposal. Valve programs the drop rates so that the vast bulk of openings result in consumer-grade (blue) weapon skins worth significantly less than the price of the key.

- **Blue Skins (Mil-Spec):** ~ 79.98% possibility
- **Purple Skins (Restricted):** ~ 15.98% chance
- **Pink Skins (Classified):** ~ 3.2% chance
- **Red Skins (Covert):** ~ 0.64% opportunity
- **Special Rare Item (Knives/Gloves):** ~ 0.26% possibility

Note: Percentages are approximations based upon community tracking and information collection.

Best Practices for Unboxing

1. **Set a Budget:** Treat case opening like entertainment (like going to a gambling establishment), not as an investment method.
2. **Purchase the Skin Directly:** If a player specifically wants a Neon Rider or an AWP Asiimov, it is practically always less expensive to buy the skin outright from the market rather than trying to unpack it.
3. **Deal With Cases as Investments:** Many players choose to purchase discontinued cases, hold them in their inventory, and offer them later on as their rarity drives the price up.
