

A malfunctioning garage door can compromise safety, convenience, and entry to your home. Whether the garage door will not open, closes unequally, makes a loud garage door sound, or has failed to respond to the remote, the appropriate repair depends on the problem. In Los Angeles, pricing and availability can also vary by neighborhood, door design, and the age of the home.
