

Walk into a rescue bay at 3 a.m., and you'll see the building functioning as tough as the personnel. Doors cycle open for incoming devices, after that seal tight to keep smoke, exhaust, and weather out of sensitive rooms. 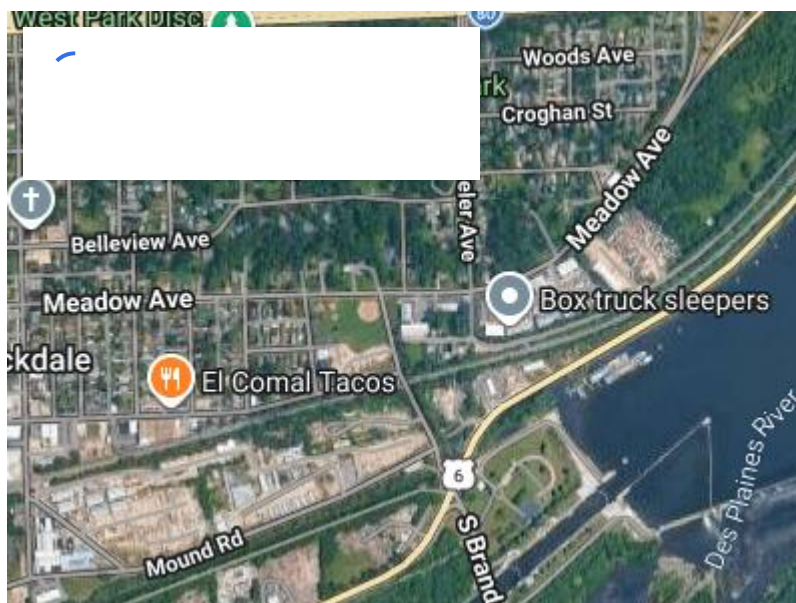
