As the table highlights, the chances of pulling a Covert product are less than 1%, and the odds of securing a rare Special item (a knife or a pair of gloves) hover around a weak **0.26%**-- roughly a 1-in-385 chance per case.

The Economics of Unboxing: Expectation vs. Reality

It is essential to view CS2 unpacking through the lens of home entertainment instead of financial investment. Mathematically, the Expected Value (EV) of opening a basic CS2 case is unfavorable.

When a player opens a case, the vast majority of the time, they will receive a Mil-Spec or Restricted skin that deserves considerably less than the £ 2.50 key used to open it.

Common Pitfalls to Avoid

- **The "Chasing Losses" Fallacy:** Believing that due to the fact that the last twenty cases yielded low-tier skins, the next one *need to* be a knife. Each case roll is an independent analytical event.

- **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15
- **Field-Tested (FT):** 0.15-- 0.38
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Some skins look unbelievable even at greater wear worths, while others look heavily battered. Understanding how float worths impact rate is vital if you mean to trade or offer your unboxed products.



3. Think About Buying Directly

If there is a particular skin you frantically want, the most cost-efficient route is often purchasing it straight off the Steam Market or a relied on third-party marketplace, instead of trying to bet for it through case openings.
