

The first time I helped a neighbor set up a sprinkler system, we allotted one weekend. We finished on the 3rd, aching, sunburnt, and a little humbled. The system worked, although we invested the following month dialing in head positioning, fixing little leakages, and learning why water pressure theoretically does not constantly match what appears of a trench line after 8 tees and a surge in quality.
