How Do Case Battles Work?

- **Start Small:** Test the waters with affordable case lobbies (e.g., £ 1 to £ 5 overall buy-ins) to understand the website's user interface and animation pacing without running the risk of substantial funds.
- **View Streamers or Community Matches:** Observing knowledgeable players can assist you understand how different case combinations behave over numerous rounds.
