Repaired house edge based upon the green/zero sections. **Case Opening** Replicates the in-game case opening experience, however often on third-party sites with custom-curated chances and higher-tier benefit pools. Incredibly variable; generally favors your home greatly. **Coinflip** A simple 1v1 PvP video game where two players wager skins of roughly equal worth. A virtual coin is turned, and the winner takes the whole pot. 50/50 chances, minus a small platform commission (rake). **Jackpot** Numerous players contribute skins to a central pot. Each skin's value figures out the gamer's "ticket" share. A spinner chooses one winner who takes everything. Based upon the overall worth contributed; platform takes a percentage charge.

Features of Modern CSGO Casinos
