

A malfunctioning garage door can create a security risk, stop you from leaving home, or cause serious injury if a spring, cable, or track fails without warning. - The style and size of the overhead garage door
- Whether the system relies on a torsion spring or extension spring
- The number of damaged components
- Whether the garage door panel can be fixed or must be replaced
