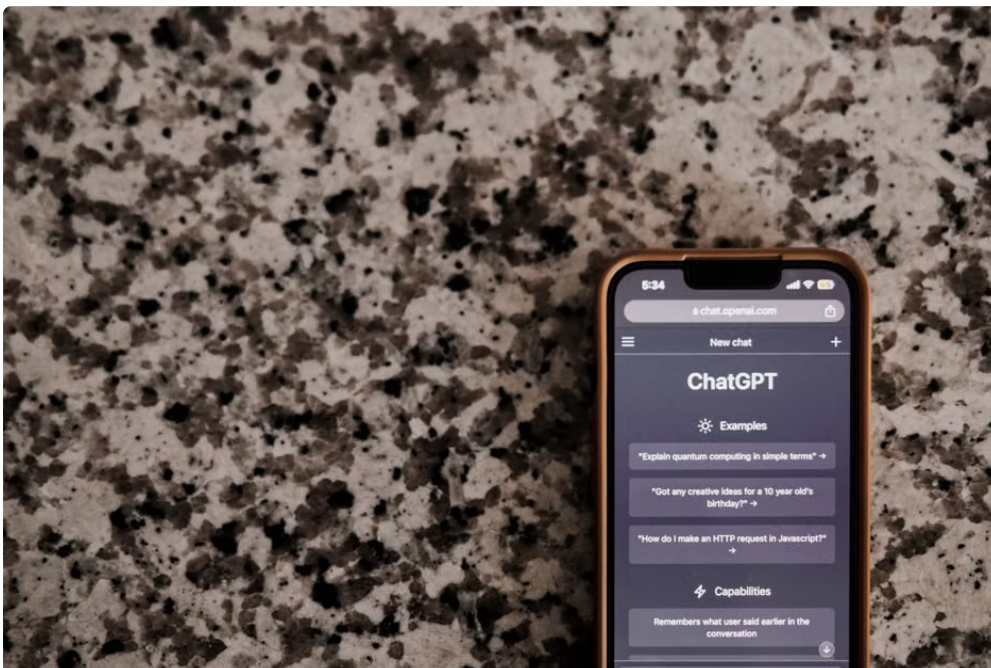

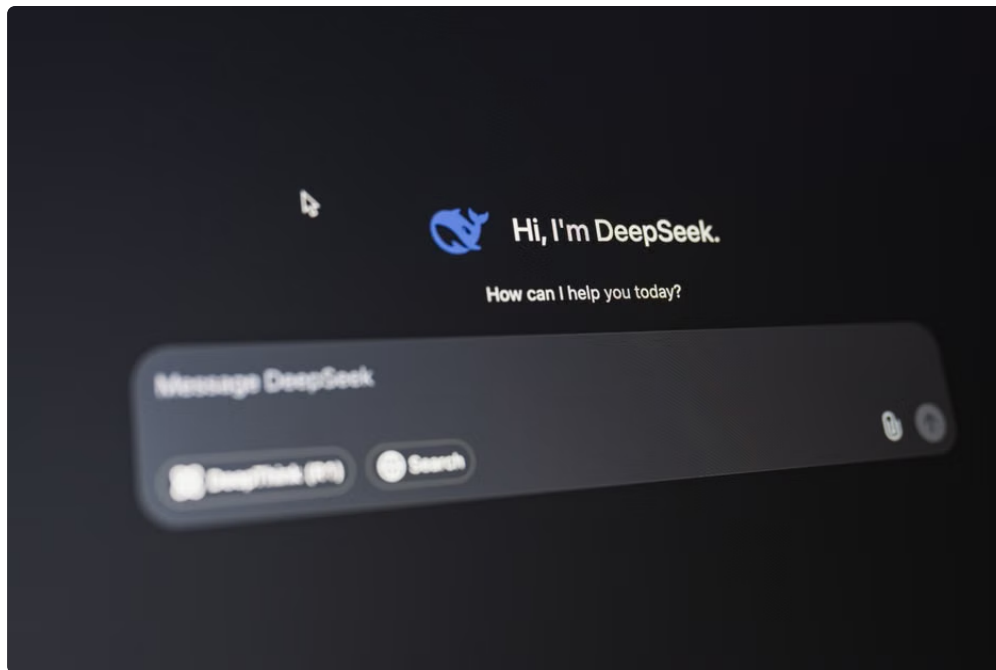
- **Validation:** TypingMind lets you run queries through multiple models, flag contradictions, and surface confidence levels or rationale, enhancing model reliability.
