1. Fixed-Percentage Bankroll Method

- **Action 1:** Determine an overall bankroll (the quantity of funds dedicated to CS: GO Crash).

- **Playing Without a Budget:** Failing to set a clear bankroll before starting result in spontaneous decisions and monetary stress.
