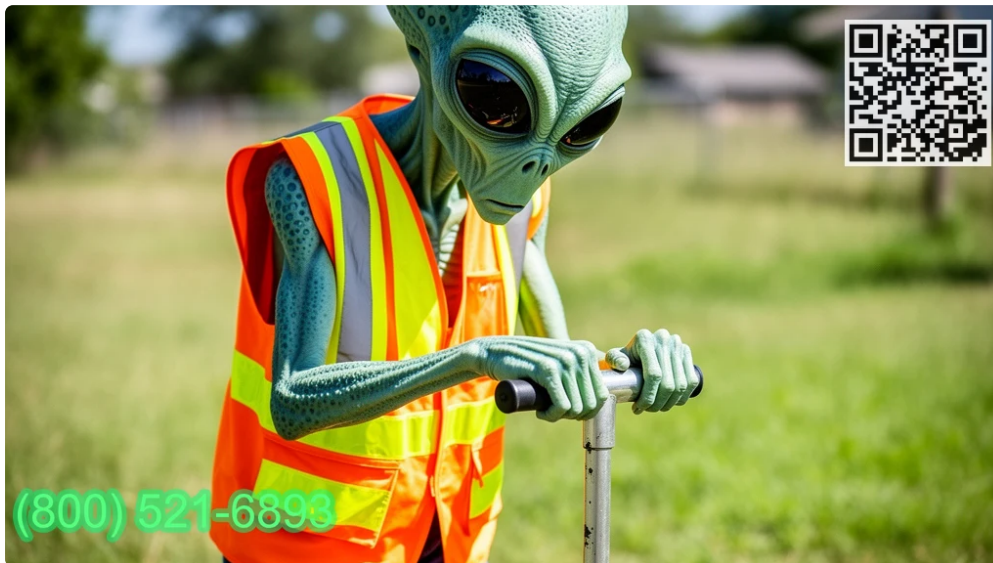
1. Mark your house drain exit factor and project a straight line outside into the yard.
