1. **Note the Error Message:** Does the game crash to desktop (CTD) silently, or does it show a particular error code (like engine.dll or memory allocation errors)?
2. **Check System Temperatures:** Overheating CPUs and GPUs will instantly throttle or shut down procedures to prevent permanent hardware damage.
3. **Verify Recent Changes:** Did the crash start happening right away after a Windows update, a graphics chauffeur upgrade, or the setup of new peripherals?

Step-by-Step Troubleshooting Solutions

1. Verify Integrity of Game Files

- **AMD Users:** Open AMD Software: Adrenalin Edition, navigate to *Checking for Updates*, and install the recommended software package.

3. Adjust Launch Options

Windows makes use of an internal function called "Fullscreen Optimizations" to manage borderless **cs2skin** windowed modes, which can sometimes disrupt DirectX rendering in older source engine video games.

- **Step 1:** Navigate to the video game installation directory site (generally C: \ Program Files (x86)\ Steam \ steamapps \ common \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive).
- **Step 2:** Locate the primary executable file (csgo.exe).
- **Step 3:** Right-click the file and choose **Properties**.
- **Step 4:** Go to the **Compatibility** tab.
- **Step 5:** Check the box for **Disable fullscreen optimizations**.
- **Action 6:** Click *Apply* and *OK*.

Advanced Troubleshooting

If standard software repairs stop working to deal with the crashing concern, the issue might lie much deeper within the operating system or hardware configuration.

Managing Overclocks (CPU, GPU, and RAM)

Many competitive gamers overclock their hardware to eke out every last frame per second (FPS). However, source engines can be notoriously conscious unstable overclocks.

- If the system has an aggressive CPU or GPU overclock applied through MSI Afterburner or the BIOS, revert the clock speeds back to factory stock settings to test stability.
- **XMP/EXPO Profiles:** Unstable RAM profiles can trigger unforeseen game crashes and memory checked out errors. Attempt disabling XMP/DOCP in the BIOS momentarily to see if crashes persist.

Running as Administrator

Permissions problems can periodically avoid the video game from composing required cache files to the storage drive.

- Locate csgo.exe, right-click it, choose **Properties**, go to the **Compatibility** tab, and check **Run this program as an administrator**.

Re-installing the Game

As a last hope, a clean reinstallation makes sure that no recurring conflicting files from old updates stay. Uninstall the video game through Steam, manually delete any staying folders in the steamapps \ common \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive directory site, and download a fresh copy.
