Step-by-Step Troubleshooting Guide

1. Verify the Integrity of Game Files

- **For NVIDIA Users:** Open GeForce Experience or visit the main NVIDIA website to download the most current Game Ready Driver.
- **For AMD Users:** Open AMD Software: Adrenalin Edition or inspect the main AMD support page.
- *Pro Tip:* If crashes began instantly after a motorist upgrade, utilize a tool like **Display Driver Uninstaller (DDU)** in Safe Mode to completely clean the old chauffeur before installing a clean variation.

3. Change Launch Options

Particular launch alternatives can require the video game to run in a more stable mode or bypass frustrating introduction videos.

To set launch choices:

1. Right-click CS: GO in Steam and select **Properties**.

5. Check for Hardware Overheating and Overclocking

- Download hardware monitoring software application like **HWMonitor** or **MSI Afterburner**.

- **Clean out physical dust** from PC fans and heat sinks every 3-- 6 months.

- **Run a disk check (CHKDSK)** periodically to make sure the storage drive real estate CS: GO has no bad sectors.
- **Avoid alt-tabbing exceedingly** during filling screens, as this is a notorious trigger for Source engine crashes.
