

A broken garage door can leave your vehicle trapped, leave open your home, or create an serious safety hazard. Garage Door Safety Tips Before a Technician Arrives

Prioritize **garage door precautions** until help arrives. Keep **children and animals** away from the door, tracks, springs, cables, and opener. Do not stand beneath a partially open door, place objects under it, or repeatedly activate the opener when the door is jammed.

Should the door be closed, leave it closed if possible. If it is open and unstable, do not attempt to lower it manually unless a qualified adult can do so safely without touching springs or cables. The **emergency disconnect cord** is intended to disconnect the opener, not to repair an unbalanced or damaged door.
