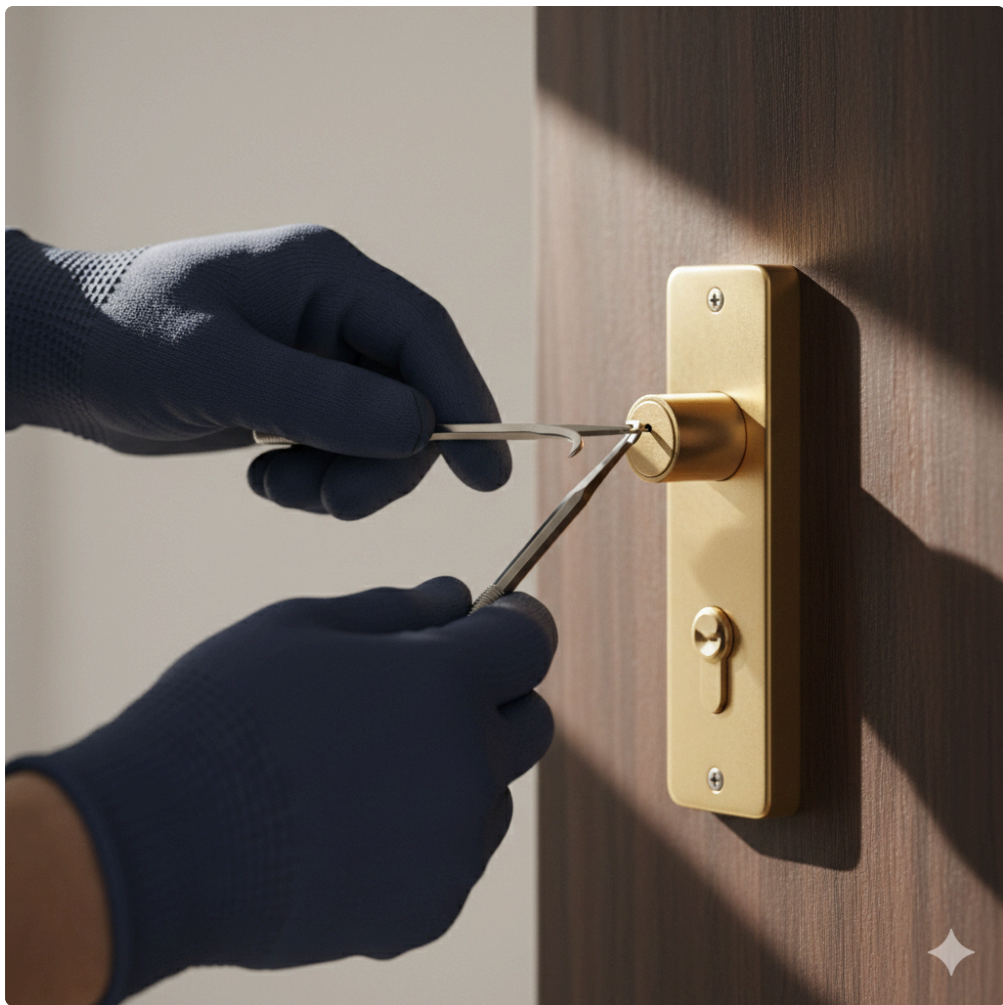
## **What drives the cost of a locksmith visit**
