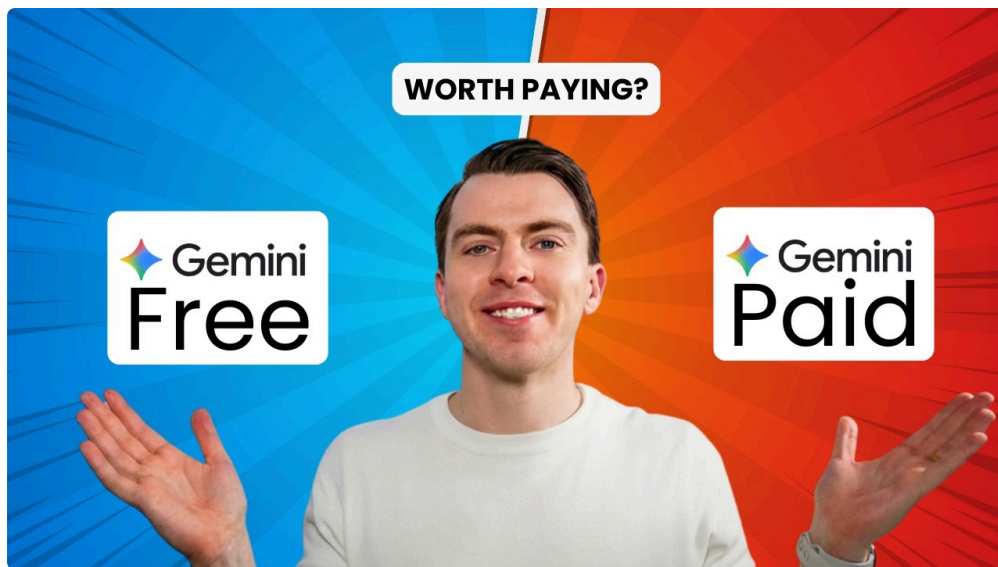
Pro Plan: Balance for Growing Teams

The Pro plan suits growing analyst teams. It expands usage limits significantly and unlocks team plans with role-based permissions. BYOK (Bring Your Own Key) support begins here, increasing data security options for sensitive industries.

Given the support improvements, Pro subscriptions also respond quicker to issues. That said, support is still tiered, and heavy users might find response times slower compared to Power or Enterprise plans.

Frontier and Power Plans: Advanced Usage and Team Management

Frontier users get early access to new AI Teams models, a key benefit for those needing bleeding-edge tools right after release. Power adds priority support and even larger usage buckets.
