The Mechanics of Skin Valuation

Valve has consistently punished the community. In 2016, the business provided widespread cease-and-desist letters to dozens of major skin gambling websites, alerting them that their activities broke the Steam Subscriber Agreement. Over the years, Valve has also carried out trade lock restrictions (forcing players to wait a week before trading a newly acquired skin) to curb rapid-fire wagering.

Regardless of these measures, the market continues to adjust. Many modern CS2 casinos make use of peer-to-peer (P2P) trading systems or cryptocurrency integrations to bypass conventional trade limitations enforced by Steam, proving resilient in the face of designer crackdowns.
