

Jamesport sits on the North Fork with a confidence that only long-established coastal towns seem to carry. It is not loud about what it offers. It does not need to be. The village and its surrounding hamlet have grown around water, agriculture, family businesses, and the steady pull of seasonal visitors who come for the beaches, the vineyards, the marina life, and the sense that time moves a little differently here.
