3. **Employ collapsible content blocks:** Let users expand details only if they want to.
4. **Create a fixed navigation menu:** Enable users to jump between rule sections smoothly.
5. **Clarify language:** Avoid jargon and explain technical terms or legal phrases in plain Filipino/English.
6. **Maintain brand consistency:** Use consistent logos, colors, and fonts matching all other Arionplay pages.
7. **Simplify login/register flow:** Clearly distinguish between actions with visible buttons and include help/support links.
8. **Test extensively on mobile browsers and data:** Ensure quick load times and responsive layout across popular PH devices and networks.
