- Licenses from countries that signed the **1968 Vienna Convention on Road Traffic** can typically be exchanged directly, though tests may be required depending upon bilateral agreements and residency duration.
- Licenses from countries under the **1949 Geneva Convention** generally require passing the theoretical state exam.
