

A malfunctioning garage door can impact access, security, and the safety of your home. Whether your garage door will not open, closes improperly, or makes a noticeable grinding sound, prompt garage door repair can keep a minor issue from becoming an expensive failure.

Photo-eye sensors are another common reason. These small sensors sit near the floor on both sides of the garage door. If they are dirty, misaligned, blocked, or damaged, the opener may refuse to close the door or may reverse immediately. Gently clean the lenses and confirm that both sensor indicator lights are visible. Do not bypass the sensors, because they are an important safety feature.

Track alignment can also prevent proper operation. A bent track, loose bracket, or obstruction may cause the door to bind. If the motor runs but the door does not move, the drive gear, trolley, spring, or lifting cable may require expert evaluation. Avoid repeatedly pressing the opener, since continued operation can harm the motor or worsen a mechanical problem.

Why Is My Garage Door Making Noise, Crooked, or Stuck?

A noisy garage door may have dry hinges, worn rollers, loose fasteners, or a problem with the garage door tracks. Squealing, rattling, grinding, and popping sounds should not be ignored. A technician can determine whether lubrication and adjustment are adequate or whether components need replacement.

A misaligned or stuck door often indicates irregular spring tension, a snapped cable, damaged rollers, or an blockage in the tracks. A torsion spring is installed above the door and manages its balance. An extension spring is generally installed along the horizontal tracks. Both types are under substantial tension and can cause major injury if handled unsafely.

Is It Better to Fix a Garage Door Panel or Replace It?

A damaged garage door panel does not always require a complete new door. A replacement panel may be reasonable when the damage is confined to one section and the existing door is still new, structurally sound, and still available from the manufacturer. Minor dents in some steel panels may be fixed, although cosmetic results vary.

Replacement becomes more difficult when the manufacturer has discontinued the design, the color no longer matches, or several panels are damaged. A sectional garage door is made of connected horizontal sections, so one failed panel can sometimes be replaced on its own. However, the technician must confirm that the new panel matches the hinges, tracks, hardware, insulation, and dimensions of the existing system.

What Is the Two-Car Garage Door Replacement Cost?
