Case Opening	Imitates the in-game case opening experience, however often on third-party websites with custom-curated odds and higher-tier benefit swimming pools. Very variable; generally favors your home greatly.	
Coinflip	A simple 1v1 PvP game where two gamers wager skins of approximately equal value. A virtual coin is turned, and the winner takes the whole pot. 50/50 chances, minus a small platform commission (rake).	
Prize	Numerous players contribute skins to a central pot. Each skin's worth figures out the player's "ticket" share. A spinner selects one winner who takes whatever. Based upon the total value contributed; platform takes a portion cost.	

Functions of Modern CSGO Casinos
