Understanding Wear Ratings and Rarities

The Five Wear Categories

When a weapon surface is dropped or unboxed, it is assigned a specific **Float Value** ranging from 0.00 to 1.00. This float identifies how scratched, worn, or faded the texture appears in-game.

Use Category Float Value Range In-Game Appearance **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful, very little to no scratches or acnes. **Very Little Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Extremely slight wear, generally visible on close evaluation. **Field-Tested (FT)** 0.15-- 0.38 Noticeable scratches and endure prominent edges. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Considerable wear, paint fading, and prominent scratches. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Heavily distressed, rusted, or seriously faded textures.

(Note: Certain items really look better or end up being preferred in greater wear conditions-- such as the "AWP|Asiimov"-- while others demand a beautiful Factory New condition to command high rates.)

Rarity Tiers

Weapon finishes are more classified by color-coded rarity tiers, which determine how often they appear in cases and trade-ups:

- **Consumer Grade/ Industrial Grade (White/Light Blue):** Common, low-tier items frequently utilized for standard trade-ups.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** Standard drop-tier items.
- **Limited (Purple):** Uncommon, desirable mid-tier finishes.
- **Categorized (Pink):** Rare and striking designs typically main to collections.
- **Covert (Red):** The highest basic weapon tier, featuring renowned designs like the Redline or Fire Serpent.
- **Special/ Extraordinarily Rare (Gold):** Knives and Gloves. These are the crown gems of the market.

The Economy: Trading, Markets, and Value

The digital economy surrounding these items is totally player-driven. Valve sets the baseline through official in-game case drops and the Steam Community Market, but a huge external ecosystem exists via third-party trading sites, peer-to-peer marketplaces, and community online forums.



Elements That Influence Price

1. **Supply and Demand:** Items from older, stopped cases are rarer, increasing their market worth.
2. **Float and Pattern Templates:** Some items feature specific pattern indexes that alter the visual look completely (e.g., the "Case Hardened" pattern, where blue quantities determine extreme value).
3. **Stickers and StatTrak:** Applying uncommon, discontinued tournament sticker labels can increase a product's value. StatTrak innovation, which tracks the variety of kills a gamer gets with a specific weapon, also commands a cost premium.
4. **Pro-Player Association:** When an expert esports player uses a specific weapon finish throughout a major competition, need for that item typically escalates over night.
