- **Live roulette:** Similar to conventional casino live roulette, but normally adapted with three colors (e.g., Red, Black, and Green), where Green uses a huge payout due to lower chances.
- **Coinflip:** A classic 1v1 video game where 2 players wager equivalent skin values, and a digital coin flip figures out the sole winner.
- **Prize:** Multiple players discard skins into a common pot. A virtual wheel spins, and the individual who contributed the most has the highest analytical possibility of winning the entire pool, though luck can prefer low-tier contributors.
