

What garage door problems require expert repair?

Numerous garage door issues can be recognized by homeowners, but repairs involving springs, cables, tracks, or lifting hardware should generally be handled by an experienced technician. An overhead garage door can weigh hundreds of pounds, and a failed component may cause the door to drop, bind, or move unexpectedly. Attempting to push a residential garage door open or closed can also damage the opener and create a major safety risk.

Common problems that warrant professional evaluation include a broken garage door spring, a frayed garage door cable, warped or misaligned garage door track, damaged rollers, and a door that is uneven or unusually heavy. A technician can carry out a garage door inspection, identify the underlying cause, and recommend repair versus replacement based on the condition of the equipment.

A garage door will not close when the photo-eye sensor detects an obstruction or is dirty, misaligned, or damaged. The two sensors near the bottom of the garage door tracks must face each other and have a clear line of sight. Wipe the lenses gently and remove objects from the opening, but do not bypass the sensor. It is a core part of the garage door safety system.

Other causes include a damaged spring, disconnected garage door cable, worn track, worn gear, or a door that is overly heavy for the opener. If the door moves in reverse, produces grinding noises, or moves merely a short distance, stop using it and schedule garage door opener repair or a full inspection. Continuously pressing the remote can worsen mechanical damage.

When is a broken garage door spring dangerous?

A broken garage door spring is dangerous because springs hold substantial energy. A torsion spring is mounted above the door and rotates as the door moves, while an extension spring extends along the horizontal tracks. Either type can break suddenly, release metal fragments, or leave the door without support. A broken spring may also cause the garage door to become very heavy.

Do not attempt to wind, cut, remove, or replace a spring with household tools. Keep children and pets away from the opening, disconnect the opener only if you can do so safely, and avoid opening the door manually. A technician can determine whether the panel can be straightened without affecting balance or operation.

Replacement may be more sensible when a panel is severely bent, cracked, rusted, water-damaged, or no longer manufactured. Matching a replacement panel can be challenging if the door has faded, been discontinued, or uses an unusual design. If multiple panels are damaged or the door has recurring problems, repair versus replacement should include the condition, insulation, safety, and appearance of the complete system.

A sectional garage door consists of connected horizontal sections that move along tracks. One damaged section may be replaced, but the new section must match the height, thickness, finish, windows, and hardware of the existing door. Door insulation can also affect comfort in an attached garage, particularly during hot inland Los Angeles conditions.

Garage door replacement cost depends on the material, insulation, windows, design, hardware, opener compatibility, removal, and installation. How much does a two-car garage door replacement cost?
