



If you have lived in Alexandria for greater than a couple of periods, you currently understand the city's plumbing has character. Brick rowhouses hide cast iron stacks. Mid-century cattle ranch homes socialize copper, galvanized steel, and the periodic mystery PVC. Basements flirt with the aquifer after a hard rain. Throw in fully grown tree roots and the clay soil along the Potomac, and you obtain an ideal dish for slow-moving drains, recurring clogs, and backed-up sewage systems.
