

What Are the Most Common Garage Door Problems in Los Angeles?

Garage door repair is often needed when a door becomes noisy, unbalanced, sluggish, or completely unresponsive. A residential overhead garage door has many moving parts, including springs, cables, rollers, tracks, hinges, and an opener. A problem with one component can affect the entire system and create a safety risk.

Next, inspect the photo-eye safety sensors located near the floor on both sides of the door. Misaligned sensors, dust on the lenses, or damaged wiring may cause the opener to reverse or refuse to close. Carefully clean the lenses and confirm that both sensors point toward one another. Do not bypass the sensors because they help prevent the door from closing on people, vehicles, or property.

The remote control may have a dead battery, damaged buttons, or a lost programming connection. Test the wall switch as well. If neither control works, the garage door opener or electrical supply may need a technician's evaluation.

A failed spring or disconnected garage door cable can also make the opener appear to fail. Do not keep pressing the opener button if the door is visibly tilted, extremely difficult to lift, or hanging from one side. Continued operation can harm the motor and lift cables.

Grinding, squeaking, rattling, or popping sounds often indicate worn garage door rollers, slack garage door hinges, unlubricated bearings, or damaged tracks. Worn rollers may become especially noticeable when a sectional garage door shifts from one section to the next. A bent track can cause the door to bind, stop, or travel irregularly.

A crooked door commonly indicates a broken spring, loose cable, or uneven tension. A torsion spring is mounted above the door and counterbalances its weight through a torsion system.
