- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, attempting to ride a winning streak while keeping losses minimized to the base bet amount.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing small bets with the objective of claiming huge multipliers (50x, 100x, or higher). This functions similar to playing the lotto.
