In reaction, the industry adjusted. Sites moved from using Steam accounts straight for automatic trading to utilizing cryptocurrencies (Bitcoin, Ethereum, GBPT) or peer-to-peer trading systems. More just recently, Valve carried out a 7-day trade hang on recently traded products, severely interrupting the immediate liquidity that made skin gambling so popular.
