Resplit Aces	Allowed (RSA)	Reduces home edge by ~ 0.03%

Advanced gamers know that a 6:5 blackjack table is a sucker's bet. They exclusively hunt for 3:2 tables, preferably where the dealership stands on a soft 17 (S17) and late surrender is allowed.

2. Card Counting in the Live Environment: Myth vs. Reality

Can you count cards in live dealership blackjack? The brief response is yes, but with considerable caveats.

3. Advanced Bankroll Management and Variance Control

- **Accounting for Side Bet Variance:** Side bets like *21 +3*, *Perfect Pairs*, and *Bust It* deal high payouts, but they also feature a devastating home edge (frequently varying from 4% to over 13%). Advanced players typically prevent side bets entirely, or treat them as a different, strictly limited home entertainment spending plan.

4. Exploiting Table Psychology and Composition-Dependent Strategy

While fundamental technique depends on the gamer's hand total versus the dealership's upcard, advanced gamers utilize **Composition-Dependent Strategy**. This indicates changing your play based upon the exact cards comprising your hand, rather than simply the overall.

Example of Composition-Dependent Play

- **Standard Strategy Rule:** Stand on a difficult 16 versus a dealership 10.
- **Advanced Composition-Dependent Adjustment:** If your tough 16 is made up of a **5-3-8** or a **4-4-4-4**, you should really **strike** rather of stand. Why?
