price of the key.

- **Blue Skins (Mil-Spec):** ~ 79.98% chance
- **Purple Skins (Restricted):** ~ 15.98% opportunity
- **Pink Skins (Classified):** ~ 3.2% opportunity
- **Red Skins (Covert):** ~ 0.64% possibility
- **Special Rare Item (Knives/Gloves):** ~ 0.26% possibility

Keep in mind: Percentages are approximations based on community tracking and information collection.

Best Practices for Unboxing

1. **Set a Budget:** Treat case opening like entertainment (like going to a gambling establishment), not as a financial investment method.
2. **Purchase the Skin Directly:** If a player particularly wants a Neon Rider or an AWP Asiimov, it is generally less expensive to purchase the skin outright from the marketplace instead of trying to unbox it.
3. **Deal With Cases as Investments:** Many players choose to buy discontinued cases, hold them in their stock, and offer them later on as their rarity drives the cost up.
