2. Utility Synergy

- **Molotovs/Incendiaries:** Used to clear tight angles (like "Newell" on Inferno or "Banana") and delay enemy presses.
- **Smokes:** Block sniper lanes and isolate bomb sites throughout execution.

3. Map Control and Defaulting
