Why on-site locksmith work fits Orlando's pace

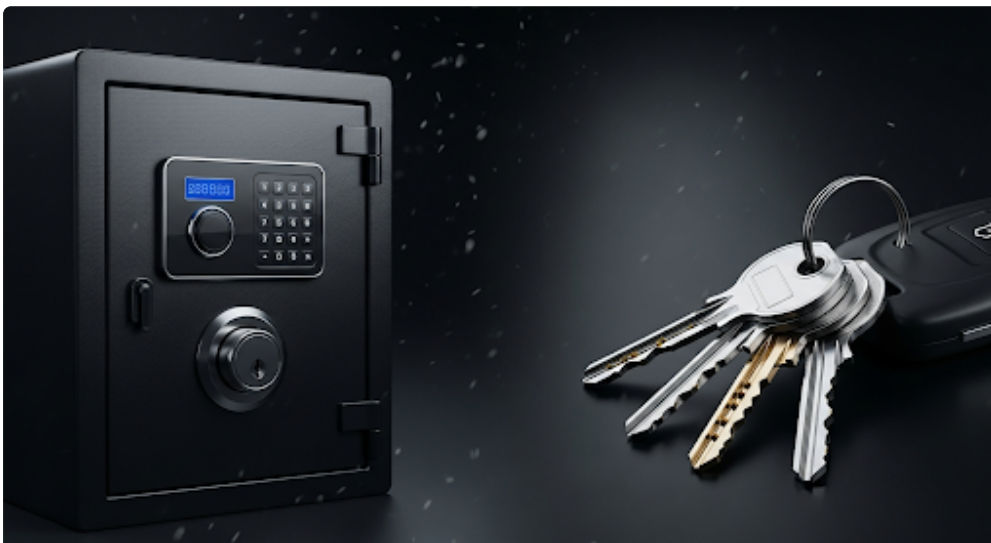
